This should once again be a busy construction season. We will have the continued projects that have been contracted with ME Collins and Yong Construction. Also, this coming late fall we will have a Contractor in for the Substation 904 improvements. Dan also plans to have a contractor in to perform maintenance on substation LTCs this spring. Our crews will be tackling many projects. An upcoming project for the water crew is the West 2nd Avenue water main replacement. Projects that were budgeted for in fiscal year 2018 will be looked at and prioritized for construction.

The 4th Corso Viaduct may be history by the time this reaches print. Wow, once they got started things moved quickly. I understand that they may have the new viaduct completed by the spring of 2019. Weather will always play a factor, but I don't see much slowing them down. The water has been bored in under the railroad and creek by ME Collins and hopefully will be tied in on both ends soon. The Gas Crew is moving a couple gas service and removing a main to be ready for the relocation of a sewer main that is needed for this project as well.

Yong Construction was to move in the week of 3/12, have a meeting with staff on 3/15 and then start construction. We likely will need to stand by to protect a multiple circuit electric primary line at the beginning of the project.

Electrical SCADA at the Power Plant is completed, but we have a few day to day corrections that need updated. They still need to go back to both the WTP and the WWTP to finish up some of the punch list, documentations, and drawings that the staff needs cleaned up. They both have been looking at and designing new communications for monitoring more of our sites, to get up to date, current time of events, changes of status, and to receive that information back at our offices.

Mike, Jeff, and Travis been working on new temperature monitoring and alarming equipment at Plant Site 2 in Syracuse on Engine #6 and #7. They have also been installing the new control room battery backups. Gary and Mike still have to move all of the equipment over to this new system.

The 904 Substation Transformer is in Jordon, MN. where it is being repaired/rebuilt to our specifications. They have started this process and expect to have it completed, tested, and shipped back to the site in April 2018. Then NCU plans on upgrading the 904 Sub with 69kv Circuit Switcher, 25kv Breaker, New Control Building, new concrete pads, enlarging the substations area and fencing to adequately design all of the upgrades to be installed with the proper clearances.
